

SAFES AND CHESTS

There are five classifications. See Chart below.

The ULC label indicates the type of protection provided by the safe.

“DR” means “Drill Resistant”.

“TL” means “Tool Resistant”.

“TR” means “Torch Resistant”.

“TX” means “Torch and Explosive Resistant”.

The figure following the above mentioned letters gives the resistance in minutes.

We often meet with safes which are ULC approved which the Insured uses to protect large sums of money, but when the label is checked it is noted that the safe is Class A, B or C. Such safes are of little value for protection from theft since they are intended to resist fire only. From the point of view of theft these safes should be considered to be Class 1.
